Thank you for your interest in the PM&R Residency Training Program at the University of Utah. Our program is a three-year comprehensive training program that accepts applicants at the PGY II level. The program has full ACGME accreditation, and we are currently accepting applications for four advanced PGY II positions beginning in July 2010. All positions are offered through the National Residency Match Program (NRMP) and applications are accepted through the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) only.

Having been in existence for more than 35 years, the PM&R Residency Training Program is both well established and dynamic. The program is dedicated to training qualified, caring clinicians, as well as future leaders in the field of PM&R.
