

**8-Hour HAZWOPER Refresher
July 14, 2009**

PURPOSE

In response to the requests of our continuing education students, the Rocky Mountain Center for Occupational and Environmental Health (RM-COEH) offers an 8-hour 1910.120 refresher course for the Intermountain Region. It meets the refresher requirements for site workers, TSDF workers, and emergency response workers as specified in 29 CFR 1910.120(e), (p) and (q).

The 8-hour course meets the refresher requirements under the OSHA 1910.120 Standard.

**Chemistry for the Non-Chemist
July 20, 2009**

PURPOSE

It is difficult to comply with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Department of Transportation (DOT), and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations without a basic understanding of chemistry. This class is meant to introduce students to basic nomenclature of chemistry, chemical properties, and terminology such as is found on Material Safety Data Sheets and in the regulations. Students will be encouraged to bring case studies and problems they might be having in the workplace. The NIOSH Pocket Guide to Hazardous Chemicals will be provided at the course.

**Hazardous Materials:
Incident Command
July 30-31, 2009**

PURPOSE

The course provides participants an opportunity to learn basic skills and knowledge necessary to assume control of the incident scene and safely manage personnel and resources. Implementation of the incident command system and command function is presented through illustrated lectures and small group activities. The course will focus on the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120 (OSHA HAZWOPER) for Incident Command training.

The course is intended for individuals within industry that have responsibilities for incident command or emergency planning at their facility.
