



## 8-Hour HAZWOPER Refresher May 4 & June 5, 2009

### PURPOSE

In response to the requests of our continuing education students, the Rocky Mountain Center for Occupational and Environmental Health (RMCOEH) offers an 8-hour 1910.120 refresher course for the Intermountain Region. It meets the refresher requirements for site workers, TSDF workers, and emergency response workers as specified in 29 CFR 1910.120(e), (p) and (q).

The 8-Hour course meets the refresher requirements under the OSHA 1910.120 Standard.

### DATE & LOCATION

These courses will be held on May 4 and June 5, 2009 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Information regarding accommodations will be provided upon receipt of registration.

## 40-Hour HAZWOPER June 15-19, 2009

### PURPOSE

The OSHA 1910.120 Standard was promulgated in response to a requirement of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) of 1986. The Standard, also known as "HAZWOPER", also applies to the following hazardous waste operations:

- ❖ Government-required clean-up operations at hazardous waste sites
- ❖ Voluntary clean-up at uncontrolled hazardous waste sites
- ❖ Emergency response operations involving substances
- ❖ Operations at RCRA Treatment, Storage and hazardous Disposal Facilities (TSDF)
- ❖ RCRA Correction Action sites

As the foundation for HAZWOPER certification, OSHA requires attendance at a 24- or 40-hour course (or equivalent professional experience). The 40-hour HAZWOPER is designed for those workers who regularly engage in hazardous waste operations. In addition, certain individuals must receive an annual "refresher" training of 8 hours.

The RMCOEH 40-hour 1910.120 course meets the requirements for site workers and TSDF workers as specified in 29 CFR 1910.120(e) and (p).

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

1. Identify common hazardous waste site hazards
2. Understand the measures to protect themselves including proper use of personal protective equipment, including respiratory protection.
3. Understand work practices to minimize risks.
4. Describe proper medical surveillance and exposure monitoring

5. Appreciate instrumentation that is used at hazardous waste sites
6. Understand the regulatory requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120
7. Understand the physical and chemical properties of chemicals, and how this information can be useful while working at a hazardous waste site.
8. Know how to use tools to assist in hazard recognition such as DOT ERG, MSDSs, and the NIOSH Pocket Guide.
9. Have an appreciation for the procedures and requirements of emergency response to chemical spills.

### CREDIT

Participants who complete the course will earn Continuing Education Units (CEUs), the national standard of recognition for nonacademic professional education. 5.0 ABIH CM Points have been awarded.
