

## MS in Clinical Investigation Tuition Scholarships

We are pleased to announce that the CCTS Research Education and Career Development program will have scholarship funds available in the 2019-2020 school year.

Students in good standing in the MS in Clinical Investigation may apply for partial tuition scholarships for fall and spring semesters. The amount of the scholarship to each student receiving an award will be between \$250 and \$1000 per semester. The amount of the scholarship and number of scholarships each semester will vary depending on the availability of funds. Students must reapply for each semester.

### Tuition Scholarship Policies and Process

- Interested students should apply by the deadline. An application available from <http://medicine.utah.edu/ccts/edu/msci> should be completed and submitted to [MSCI\\_Admin@lists.utah.edu](mailto:MSCI_Admin@lists.utah.edu). Student must reapply for each semester.
- Tuition scholarship applications will be reviewed and award decisions made by a subcommittee of the MSCI Curriculum Committee.
- Students may not receive support for more than 4 semesters in total.
- Tuition awards will be paid directly from the MSCI program to University tuition accounting.
- Students are expected to utilize other sources of funds available to them, including training grants and employee tuition reduction, before using tuition scholarship funds.

### Minimum Eligibility Standards for Tuition Scholarships

- *Admission to MSCI*
  - The student must be admitted for the MS in Clinical Investigation degree.
- *Progress toward graduation*  
Adequate progress will be indicated by:
  - The student must have completed at least 5 credits of core coursework before the semester to which the tuition scholarship is applied.
  - Students who will have been in the MSCI program for one year or longer by the beginning of the semester to which the tuition scholarship is applied must have
    - completed at least 11 credits of classroom work,
    - formed a graduate committee and submitted an MS Project Plan, and
    - submitted a Student Progress Review.
  - The student's transcript must not include any grades of "Incomplete". Grades of "T" for MDCRC 6960 are not considered "Incomplete" for this purpose.
- *Participation in Clinical and Translational Seminars*  
The student must be an active participant in K-Club, MSCI Research in Progress (MSCI RIP), Translational Research in Progress (T-RIP), and special seminars scheduled as MSCI Project defenses. Beginning for Spring semester 2016, students must have:
  - attended at least 5 of these sessions in the last 6 months and
  - presented at one of these meetings in the last six months or be scheduled to present.
