Addiction Health Services Research: NIH Funding Opportunities for Early Career Investigators

Dr. Lori Ducharme & Dr. Tisha Wiley

NIDA and NIAAA staff described new and recurring funding opportunities for addiction health services research. Workshop also included general grantsmanship advice, including understanding NIH policies for new investigators, working with program officers, common issues in review, and an overview of the funding process.



Early Career Development

Research Collaboration with States - Opportunities to Shape Addiction Treatment Systems

Dr. Sharon Reif, Ms. Stephanie Brown, Dr. Julie Donohue, Mr. Thomas Fuchs, and Dr. Charles Neighbors

Presenters built on their experience to present information on the range of opportunities to identify strengths; federal, state and foundation sources of funding; practical advice for researchers on how to identify appropriate state agencies and for states on how to identify interested researchers; how to initiate and build a partnership; and examples of specific projects. Session also included a panel of researchers and state representatives to discuss the opportunities, advantages, rewards and challenges of their partnerships.



Research Methods

Introduction to Causal Effects Estimation and Strategies for Handling Selection Bias in Substance Use Research

Dr. Beth Ann Griffin

This workshop aimed to promote the use of causal inference methods to improve substance use researchers' ability to conduct robust analyses of observational data. Dr. Griffin described the motivation for and an overview of causal inference methods, particularly focusing on propensity score techniques. She then reviewed guidelines on how to implement propensity score weighting when interest lies in comparing two groups, showcasing a new menu-driven app that can be used to implement analyses.



Statistical Methods

Modeling to Learn: Helping Care Teams Improve Implementation of Medication Assisted Therapies for Alcohol and Opioid Use Disorders

Dr. Lindsey Zimmerman and Dr. David Lounsbury

This workshop demonstrated the use of participatory system dynamics to improve the implementation of medication assisted therapies (MAT) for alcohol and opioid use disorders. Participants learned to identify key system dynamics that facilitate or constrain implementation of MAT for AUD and OUD, which vary as a function of local patient demand for services and local staffing resources.

Tips to Launch a Successful Career for Early Investigators

Dr. Constance M. Horgan, Dr. Haiden Huskamp, Dr. Andrea Acevedo, Dr. Katharine Bradley, Dr. Brooke Evans, and Dr. Gary Zarkin

This workshop included a panel of senior researchers from a variety of settings to give "nuts and bolts" guidance to new researchers interested in learning more about opportunities for research both in and beyond academia. Topics included setting priorities for the range of opportunities that arise across research, teaching and service; collaborating with other researchers; collaborating in community and other settings; writing manuscripts and grant reviews; identifying and evaluating grant opportunities.



Early Career Development

Understanding the Economic Impact of Multisite and Multisystem Interventions: Budget Impact, Cost Effectiveness, and Cost Savings of Implementation and Treatment Interventions Addressing Substance Use Disorders

Dr. Sean M. Murphy and Dr. Kathryn McCollister

This workshop provided a brief overview of economic evaluation methods (e.g., micro-costing, cost effectiveness analysis, cost-benefit analysis) and described the unique aspects pertaining to the economics of implementation



Research Methods

Introduction to Causal Mediation Methods for Substance Use Research

Dr. Donna Coffman

This workshop introduced principles of systems science that can be applied to improve implementation of evidence-based pharmacotherapy; described why participatory learning from simulation improves team's decision-making related to MAT; demonstrated the Medication Management (MM) module of Modeling to Learn, which enables teams to experiment with how team decisions about referrals, time allocation and visit frequency impact the quality of MAT for patients, and illustrated how simulation learning, using hyper-local team data, helps to identify the best way to optimize local MAT implementation resources.



Statistical Methods

How to Get Published in Addiction Science

Dr. Richard Saitz and Dr. Allison Lin

This workshop covered choosing the right journal, preparing your paper for submission, revising your paper, conflicts of interest, predatory journals and publishers, and other ethical issues. Workshop also touched on the culture of academic publishing and tips for getting your paper published.

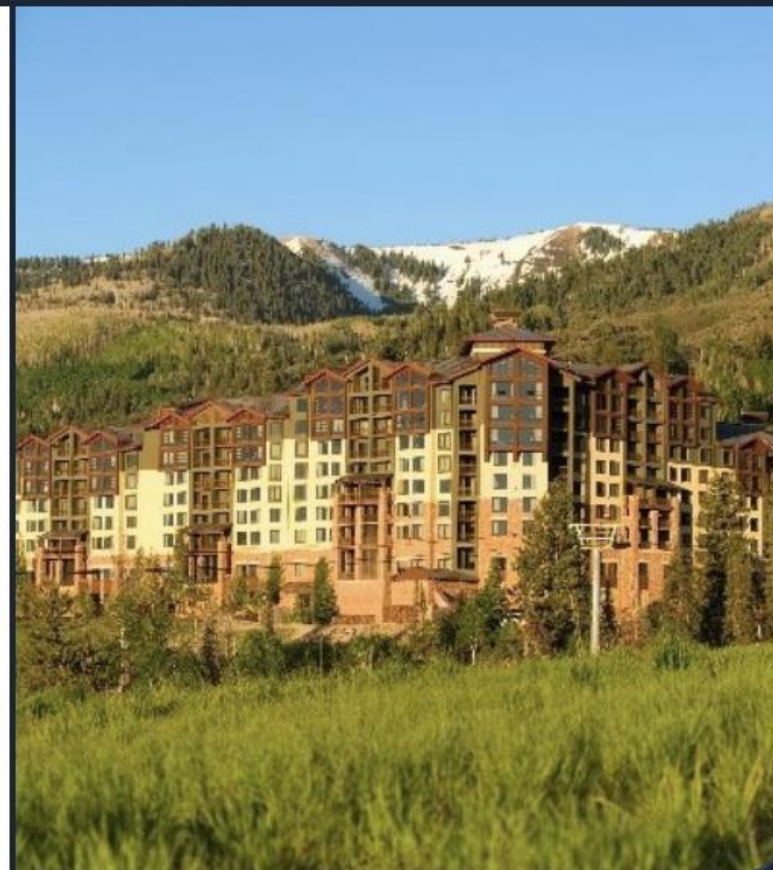

Instead of: alcoholic, user, addict
Try: person with an alcohol addiction; individual engaging in risky use of substances
Goal: person first language reinforces the individual's identity as a person first and foremost.

Language that acknowledges the medical nature of substance use disorders and treatment. For instance:

Instead of: referring to individual's moral failings or lifestyle choices
Try: acknowledging the myriad of physiological, genetic, psychological, and sociocultural factors that contribute to substance use
Goal: using language that reflects the medical nature of substance use disorders and treatment broadens consideration for the many factors that influence substance use

The use of language that promotes recovery. For instance:

Instead of: noncompliant, unmotivated, resistant, to describe patients
Try: opted not to, has not begun, experiencing ambivalence about change
Goal: recognize the individual's agency, choice, and preferences in the recovery process, even when in conflict with a professional's recommendations

Justice System Responses to the Opioid Crisis
Missed Opportunities to Improve Public Health & Public Safety

- >10M arrested & 2M incarcerated annually
- 17-19% of inmates have used opioids; <1% receive MOUD
- <5% of jails offer MOUD to inmates
- 13x risk of dying of a drug overdose during re-entry
- MOUD during incarceration cuts mortality by up to 75%
- 95% return to community; 4.7M on probation or parole
- Justice-referred patients are 1/10 as likely to receive MOUD
- Many drug courts or probation officers prohibit MOUD

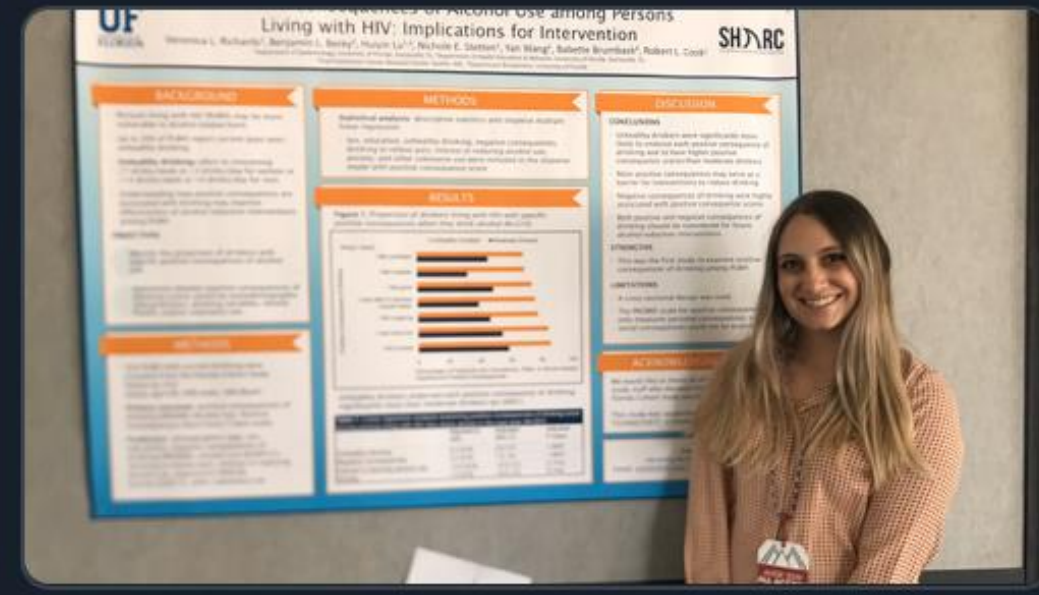

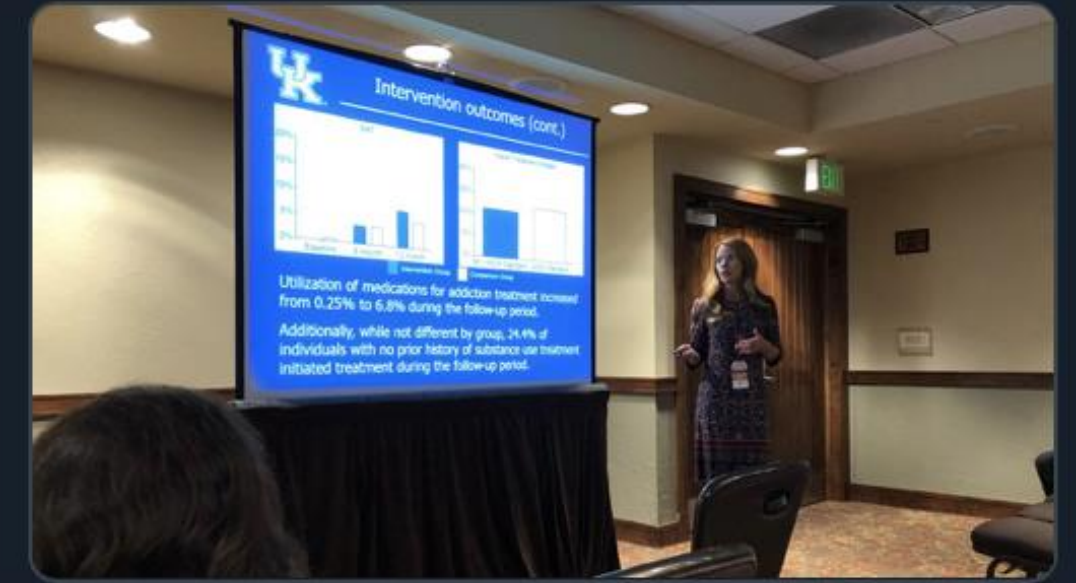

Gaps in standards of care for pregnant people with OUD in jail

- MOUD and avoiding withdrawal are the established standard in pregnancy
 - Jails are a crucial moment of access to care
- Lack of mandatory standards and oversight in jail health care enables discretion & variability
- Limited availability of MOUD in jail settings, even for pregnant people
 - 47% withdraw; 31% methadone continuation; 22%

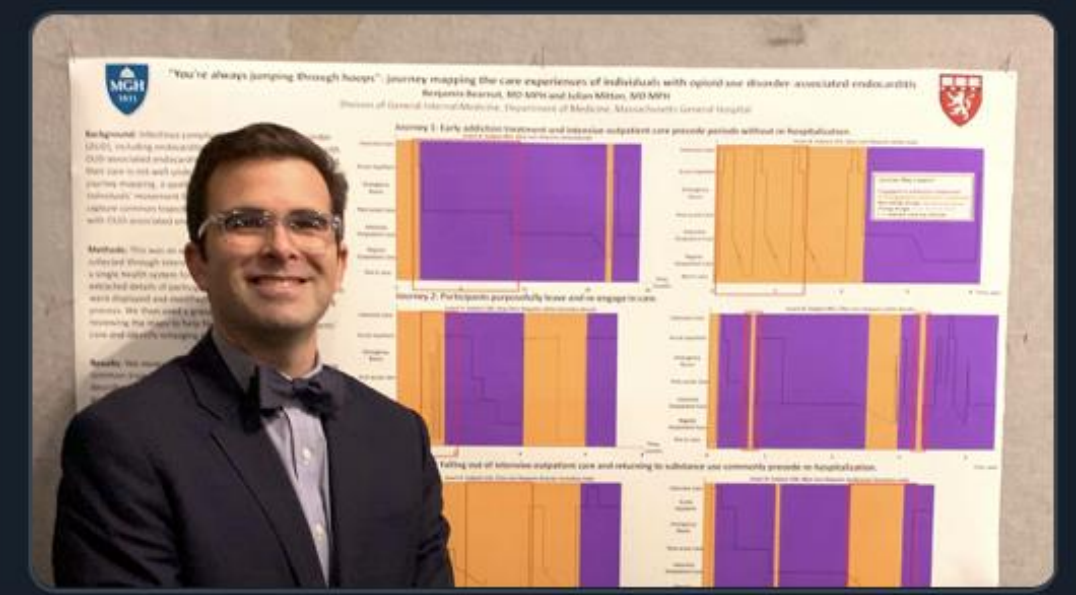

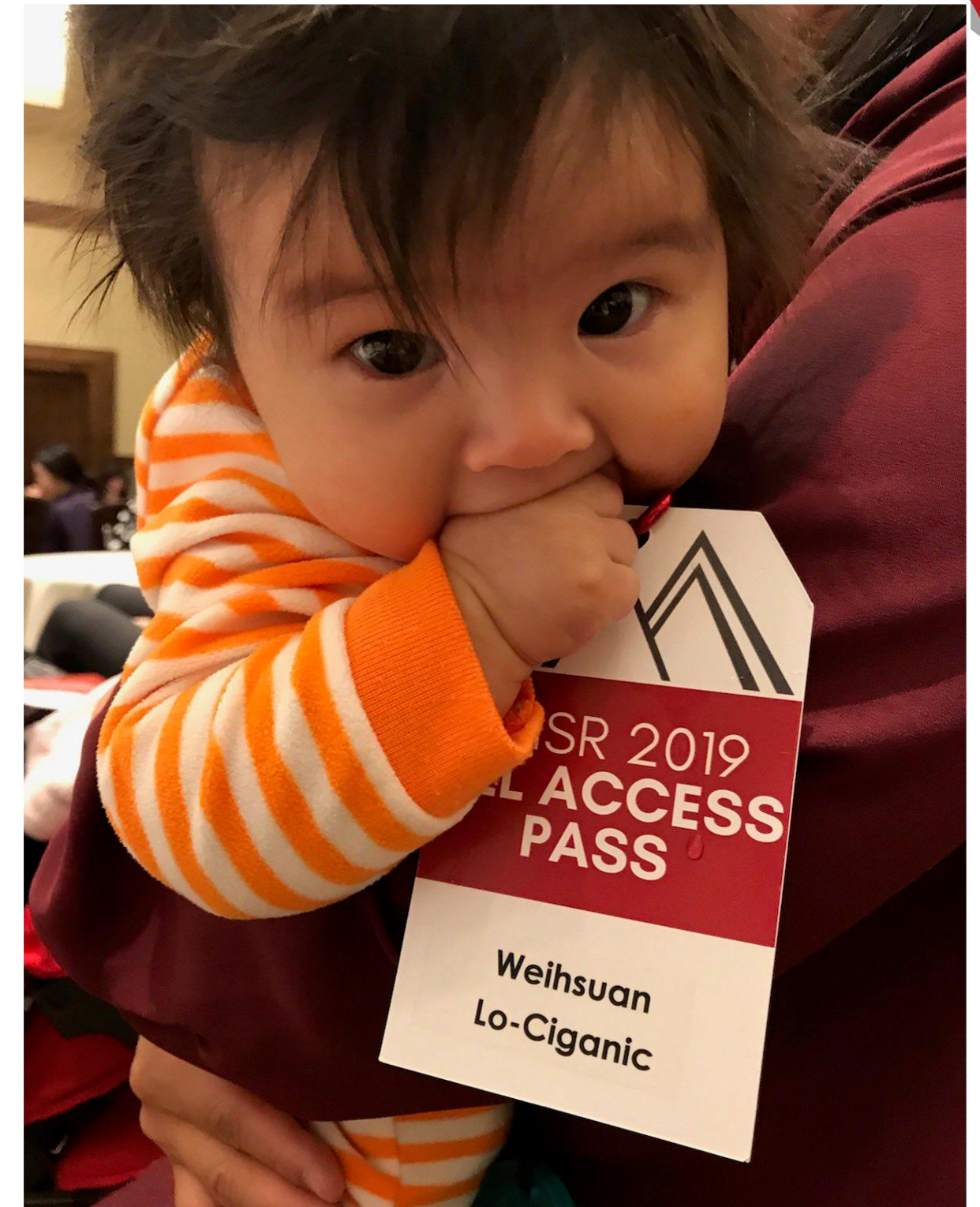
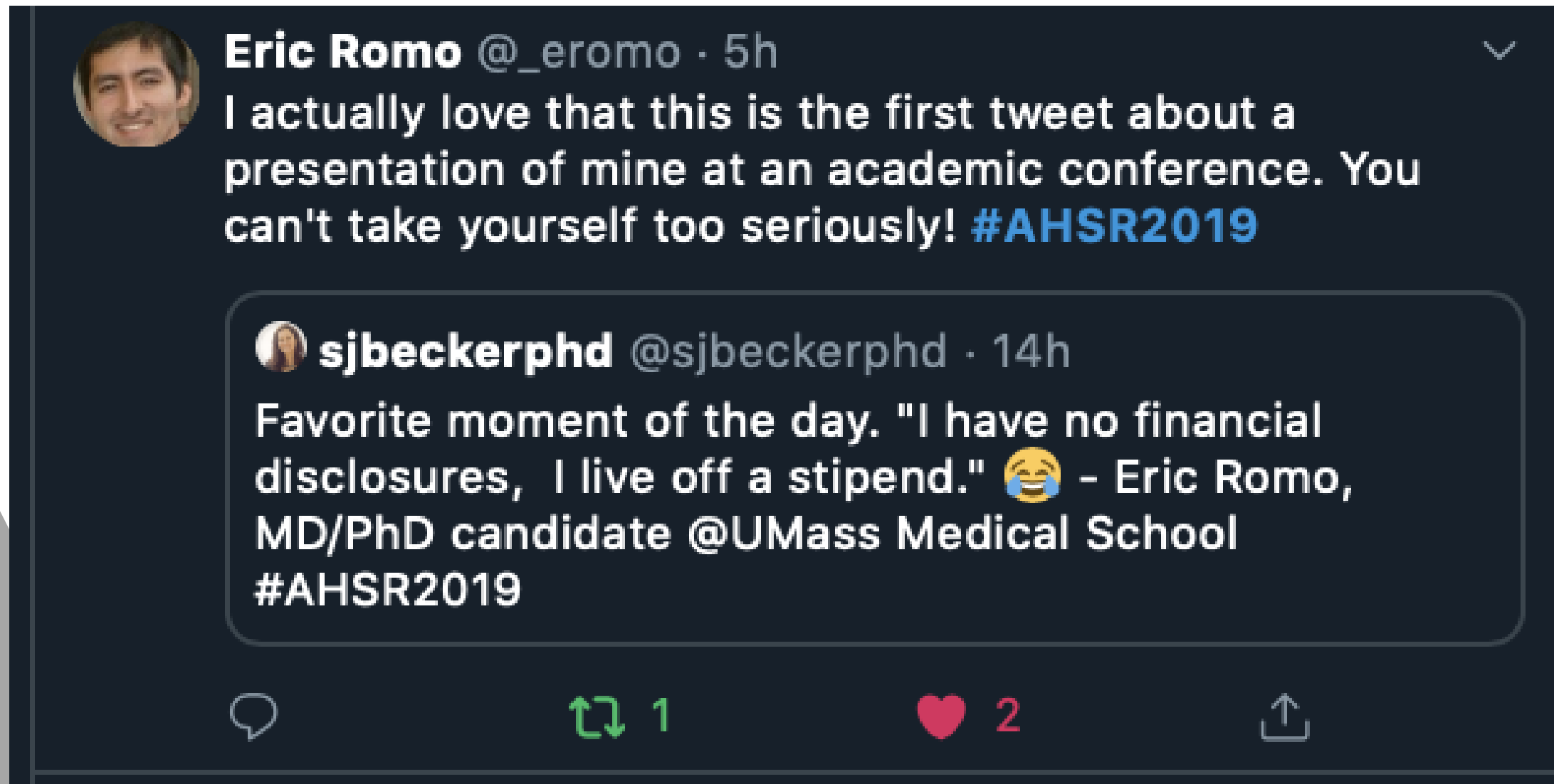
